NHS Test and Trace: COVID-19 testing for students in January 2022

Dear Parents and carers

Firstly, I would like to thank you for your continued support during this academic year which has seen more disruption due to the pandemic.

As you will have seen in the media, the government plan currently is that secondary school students will have 1 Lateral Flow Tests before or upon returning to school in January 2022.

Following this, secondary school pupils will return to the twice weekly at home testing that we have seen in place this summer term. Testing remains voluntary but strongly encouraged.

Along with the other protective measures we are taking, these tests will help staff and students to remain in school safely. Up to one third of people who have coronavirus experience no symptoms. By testing we will help to stop the virus spread and help to keep our school open as safely as possible. The test is voluntary, but I would encourage everyone to take it.

If you are happy for your child to be tested, please follow the instructions on the enclosed consent form. Any student who is over the age of 16 can self-consent but I would encourage you to discuss these tests together.

You will need to access your Parent Pay account to give consent. For safeguarding reasons, we cannot accept emails or other forms of communication instead of the Parent Pay response as we know that only you have access to your Parent Pay account. No test will be conducted on your child if they are under 16 and we have not got your consent. Similarly, we will only conduct tests on those students who are over 16 with their written consent. Those taking the test will be supervised by trained staff.

Testing will be offered free of charge.

What if you gave consent for March 2021 or September 2021 return?

You do not need to re-consent if you have previously given consent for the Lateral Flow Tests when school returned in March 2021 or September. However, if you did not give consent then, but you would like to now, you will need follow the attached instructions.

When and where will tests take place?

6 th Form	8.45am – 9.20am	School gymnasium
Year 7	Period 1 (9.20am – 10.20am)	
Year 8	Period 2 (10.20am – 11.20am)	
Year 9	Period 3 (11.40am – 12.40pm)	
Year 10	Period 4 (12.40pm – 1.40pm)	
Year 11	Period 5 (2.10pm – 3.10pm)	

Sixth Form students can proceed directly to the Gymnasium on their arrival to school from 8.45am. All other year groups will be collected from their classroom to come to the gymnasium. Only students with consent will be allowed to complete the Lateral Flow Test. Testing will not be provided if consent has not been received before **Friday 17th December at 9.00am**.

What if a student tests positive?

Participating students who test positive will be informed about their results individually. Where participants are under 16, parents or legal guardians will be notified. Guidance on safe travel and additional precautions will be provided along with test results.

You will have to self-isolate and follow the guidance from NHS Test and Trace and seek a confirmatory PCR test.

What happens if the test is negative?

You will be able to resume your activities as normal. A student will only be told if they test positive on a 'lateral flow' test, so if you do not hear you can assume it was negative. A small number of students may need to repeat the test if the first test was invalid or void for some reason.

What if my child develops symptoms?

This testing programme at school is for people with no symptoms. If your child develops symptoms at any time (such as a high temperature; a new, continuous cough; or a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste) they must immediately self-isolate, and book a test by calling 119 (England, Wales and Northern Ireland) or 0300 303 2713 (Scotland) or visiting <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>.
